The Eugenic Minds project, comprised of a documentary by Pavel Štingl and animations and paintings by Xenia Hoffmeisterová, offers timeless meditation upon the abuse of the human pinnacles of science and education. It also addresses the question of academic careerism, which under totalitarian regimes reaches selfdestructive proportions.

The project is coordinated by the Shoah Memorial Prague that is preparing the launch of the Holocaust Memorial in the Czech Republic. Eugenic Minds had its Czech premiere in March 2014 at the One World film festival in Prague. This exhibition is the first of its kind abroad.
